

At 7:30 pm, Council Member Thompson declared the public hearing convened. The budget estimate was considered and no objections were received. Motion by Tiedeman to adopt the budget and file it with the County Auditor and to adopt a resolution entitled:

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1995

Seconded by Goff. Roll was called with the following voting AYE: Armstrong, Tiedeman, Goff and Thompson.

Motion by Armstrong to name Robert Menefee to serve on the County Landfill board. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

The Council took no action on the written safety policies until they could be studied further.

Departmental reports were heard and correspondence read.

The patrol had been checked and repairs are to be made.

Motion by Tiedeman to pull the motor and get it overhauled.

Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Goff to accept the estimate of the Fontanelle Lumber Co. for enclosing the shop area at the new city building. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Armstrong to allow Delmer Miller and Garry Miller to attend a water school in Atlantic and to pay the registration for both.

Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Tiedeman to give the \$1000 check from SIMECA to the Fontanelle Development Corp. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Police Chief Smith presented his monthly reports.

Mrs. Bob Jacobson and son Andy were present to ask Council about getting new street signs. Several fund raising ideas were presented.

Motion by Armstrong to go along with the proposal of putting up new street signs. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Armstrong to buy the Hydraulic Basket Truck from the REC for the quoted price of \$15,000. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Reports from the Enterprise Club stated that on April 30th the 4-H groups are going to clean the half tubs that are located around the square. They ask permission to use the old fire station to mix the dirt and peat moss. The Lions Club will put new bands on the tubs.

The Slab Supper is to be held on June 2nd. It was suggested that other projects could be held that evening such as a parade of older cars, street painting for the youngsters and the 4-H clubs and FFA could have booths.

Motion by Armstrong to close some streets for an hour or so on the night of June 2nd to accommodate the older cars parading, the street painting and booths for the different clubs. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Temporary employment for summer jobs was discussed. Applications will be accepted at the April 4th meeting.

There was discussion on zoning of restricted residence districts. The lawyer is drawing up the plans.

Motion by Tiedeman to adjourn. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

After finding the back door to the library unlocked on two separate occasions, the library asked to have something done. After inquiring of Chief Smith if he had been checking the back doors, he said, "No, just the front." He is to start checking all business and public building doors, front and back. Motion by Armstrong to have a dead bolt installed on the library's back door. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

The library roof leaked last year. Lois is to accept bids for tarring and repairing the library roof and the city hall roof.

The safety committee is to review the safety policies and recommend acceptance or changes at the next meeting.

John Fox of Blacktop Service will send an estimate on street to be worked on this summer as soon as possible. Council Tiedeman is to talk to Cummins Construction about the reconstruction of some of the street and also drainage.

Ray Palzkill of Palzkill-Shunk & Associates, spoke with the Council about the dry pit pumps that were installed at the sewer lift station. Both pumps are operational. The bill from Pumpex for the two pumps has been paid by Palzkill-Shunk. Motion by Armstrong to pay the agreed bill of \$18,150.00 plus \$645.10 shipping charges. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Restricted residence sections were discussed. The City attorney had prepared an ordinance to correct the legal description of the City code, 155.18. Motion by Tiedeman to suspend and dispense with the laws and rules providing that ordinances shall be fully and distinctly read on three different meetings, and that the proposed ordinance be placed on its last reading. Seconded by Goff. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Armstrong, Tiedeman, Pitts and Goff. NAY: None. Motion by Goff to approve the ordinance and have the Mayor sign it. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and adopted as:

ORDINANCE 140

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1992, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO RESTRICTED RESIDENCE DISTRICT.

Dew Cass and Viola Larson spoke to the Council regarding clean-up. Nuisance abatement notices are to be sent.

Applications for temporary summer employment were viewed. Five applications were returned to City Hall. Motion by Thompson to hire

Kevin Pitts, Michael Homan and Nathan Jensen. Seconded by Goff. Carried with four votes Aye, and Pitts abstaining. The work they will do will consist of mostly street reair, cleaning and painting. Dale Sickles, street superintendent, will be in charge of the work done by the temporary employees. Breaks were also discussed. It was decided that breaks will not be taken at City Hall, only where the job is located and will consist of 15 minutes in the morning and 15 minutes in the afternoon.

The street sign project by the 4-H was discussed. Twenty-two signs at \$50 a sibn had been sold. The proceeds will be used to purchase the signs and the 4-H group will install them with assistance form the City crew if necessary.

Departmental reports were given. Delmer listed the known items that had been stolen for the sop area. Some had been recovered but were damaged. Delmer also reported that the maintainer is being worked on.

Chief Smith presented his monthly reports.

Motion by Armstrong to adjourn. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.
