Motion by Armstrong to approve a building permit for Chuck and Julie Williams for a garage if it is built to code. Seconded by Pitts. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Thompson to approve a beer permit for Penny's Food Pantry. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Mildred Zimmerline was unable to attend the hearing for her abatement notice. She submitted a letter and her son Jr. Zimmerline attended in her stead. Jr. explained that the white car on his mothers Property is a different one, and that they have now received the title for it. The Council commented on how much better Jr.'s property in the south part of town looks.

The street estimates from Balcktop Service were viewed. As the reconstruction of some of the streets is not done yet, Councilman Tiedeman is to contact Cummins Construction for an estimate of cost and time of completion. A few questions about the street estimates were raised and Mayor Ehrenfried is to meet with John Fox as soon as possible to have these questions answered.

Two roof estimates were received for tarring and patching the City Hall roff and the library roof. It was decided to get estimates for rubber coating the roofs.

After studying the 911 map, it was decided to name the street at the east end of town that connects with 255th St. county road, "Old Mill Road". Motion by Thompson to have an ordinance drawn up by the city's attorney to that effect. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. The public hearing to pass this ordinance will be held at the regular meeting of the Council on June 6, at 7:30 pm.

It was decided to have the house on the property just east of City Hall removed along with the lean-to connected to City Hall. After this is completed, the properties will probably be sold. An advertisement will be put in the paper for bids on this work. It was also decided to get the elevation figures from H R Green Co. for installing a sewer line to the town lot and then receive bids for the sewer line's installation.

Andy and Patty Jacobson updated the Council on the sale of street signs and memorial markers by the 4-H group. They were lacking approximately 17 or 18 signs. Motion by Armstrong for the 4-H group to go ahead and order all the signs in black on white. The city will purchase any signs that the group is unable to raise the money for. Seocded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

The departmental reports were given.

Delmer reported that a contract from WAPA describing the tie 1 line had been received. Motion by Pitts to have the Mayor sign this contract after viewing by the city attorney. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. A seconded contract from WAPA pertaining to the power we receive from WAPA and changing it to a fixed allocation was viewed. Motion by Thompson to have the Mayor sign this contract if the maximum amouts check out. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

The tree project on state ground was discussed. Delmer informed the Council that the grant had been approved for up to \$5914.50, with

the state to reimburse the city. Some on the civic groups are to be approached for assistance and possible maintenance of the ground in future.

Chief Smith presented his monthly reports.

Clint Hight discussed the City's wishes on nuisances. Motion by Tiedeman to have Mildred Zimmerline clean the front of her property. Seconded by Thompson. After more discussion, Tiedeman withdrew his motion and Thompson withdrew his second.

Lois asked if the Council wanted to order a copy of the Municipal Employee Salary and Benefit Survey. An advance order would be \$25. The Council decided it was not wanted.

Clean-up day was also discussed. The middle of June was considered for this. Albert is to talk to some civic organizations for their opinions.
