A discussion on fences and other obstructions being placed on the outside of sidewalks ensued. Also, the attorney is to send to home owners, letters requesting them to replace sidewalks that they had removed since the ordinance was passed stating that when a sidewalk is removed, it must be replaced.

The attorney is going to send a copy of Greenfield's tree ordinance to the council members for study before deciding if any changes should be made in our code and if so, what possible changes they might want.

The weed committee will look at the whole town this week and send a list of names to the attorney for letters to be sent to home owners with a weed problem.

The Southwestern Iowa Coalition invited Fontanelle to join its organization and contribute member dues. Motion by Tiedeman to not join. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

The departmental reports were given and correspondence read. Delmer reported that the Ford dump truck probably needs a valve job. It was suggested that Max Gross could do the repairs.

It was also decided to use 4" line when running water to the shop. This way if there is ever a need for more water in that area, the line would not have to be replaced.

The sewer plans are permits for putting sewer line into the shop are ready. The council will take local bids for this work.

Delmer informed the council on what he had found about tractors for sale from the State.

Two trees from the small park under the water tower, will be removed and one replanted in the park.

Delmer gave notice that he will be retiring the first of October after 34 years of working for the City.

The sale of property to Brad Bax for a car wash is still under discussion.

Utility hearings must be available to anyone requesting one, if they have failed to pay their utility bills and have been sent a letter of disconnection.

A letter is to be snet to HGM about the work done to the entrance to the post office.

The police reports were presented.

The Mayor questioned Mel about his not attending the last two reserve meetings. Mel stated that he trys to make them. Mel also said he is required to have 12 hours a year of training through LEA to be recertified.

The plug in the bottom of the radiator was missing, and that was the cause of the police car overheating. Mel was asked if he had noticed anything suspicious during the time the car had been parked at his house. Mel replied that he hadn't.

A hole in the reserve tank of the cooling system was brought to Mel's attention. Also, when the new plug was put in the radiator, a new was not put on.
