Summer street work was discussed. John Fox said they are going to have their own plant in the area. Kyle Culver had also stopped at City Hall earlier in the month.

Mike Cass representing the Enterprise Club, asked for a donation for the fireworks display for this years 4th of July celebration. The total cost of the fireworks will be almost \$2000. Motion by Tiedeman to contribute \$1000 toward the cost of the fireworks. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Ron Dykstra, an engineer with DeWild Grant Reckert, discussed proposed electric plans for the coming year. In the area of the nursing home, underground lines will replace what is now overhead. In the south area, lines will be replaced that are about 20 years old and have quite a few faults. The approximate cost of doing both areas is \$200,000, along with new mapping of the whole system. Motion by Pitts to sign an agreement with DGR for the engineering of these projects and the mapping. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Brad Honl representing the Good Samaritan Center, was also in attendance to listen to the discussion about the proposed electric projects. He also informed the Council that they had gotten permission to install the grease trap that the Council feels is necessary for the elimination of the sewer problems in that area. The trap will be a 640 gallon cement tank.

The removal of the house east of the City Hall and the lean-to connected to the City Hall was discussed. Cummins Construction gave an estimate of \$1900 for removal and disposal of these buildings and the removal and backfilling of the storm cave on the property. Motion by Armstrong to accept Cummins' estimate. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Pitts to sell the properties east of City Hall to Brad Bax if used as a car wash. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Linda Jensen had gotten costs for two kinds of paint for the Library walls. They think it will take 3 gallons. They feel it would be better if they did the painting themselves so they could do small areas and cause less disruption of the Library services. Motion by Armstrong to all the painting. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

The 95/96 budget was viewed. After some discussion, a motion by Tiedeman was made to approve the proposed budget estimate for publication and set the Public Hearing for the next regular meeting, March 6, 1995, at 7:30 pm. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Departmental reports were given.

Garry informed the Council about the possibility of the government selling WAPA to investor owned utilities. This would most likely drastically raise our cost of electricity. In turn, the City's rates would have to increase. Letters have been written to our Congressmen and Senators opposing this sale.

Garry asked about attending a meter and metering school in Ames. Motion by Pitts to allow the attendance. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Garry also asked to attend a meeting in Des Moines of Federal regulations. Motion by Tiedeman to allow attendance. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

The sidewalk forms that were ordered have arrived.

The dump trucks, sanders and snowplows from the State have not come in yet. Garry will keep calling to determine when they have a selection to choose from.

Two meetings had been attended in conjunction with SWISS for safety.

The possible purchase of an arc welder was discussed. The Council feels that having a welder could save money on repairs.

Mel presented his monthly reports.

He also informed the Council that weapon qualification will be held soon. No date has been set yet. Also, PR 24 recertification (night stick) will be soon. Again, no date has been set.

Motion by Armstrong to adjourn. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.
