

Motion by Thompson to approve Dean Lamb's building permit for a garage, barn and the addition of a bathroom to the house, if it conforms to code. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

John Fox had to cancel appearing before the Council concerning streets because of bad weather.

Bill Glassell had informed the Mayor that he would like to sell some land to his son to build a house if details could be arranged with the city. Motion by Thompson to open 7th St. partially, so there will be access to the new house. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

The bridge on 3rd St. will be inspected this spring. A suggestion was made to remove the bridge and install a large tube. No action will be taken at this time.

Cummins Construction has had mechanical trouble with their truck, so progress has stopped until repairs can be made.

Motion by Armstrong to give the \$1000 check from SIMECA to the Fontanelle Development Corp. Seconded by Tiedeman. Carried unanimously.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Garry showed the Council a proposal submitted by ChemTrol to spray the lagoon, sub station and other areas. Motion by Pitts to accept the amount of the proposal. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Tiedeman to have a phone installed at the town shop. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

OSHA regulations for fire resistant clothing and gas monitoring for confined space were discussed. Motion by Tiedeman to purchase a gas monitor and to share a calibration kit with Greenfield. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously. Motion by Thompson to have the town furnish fire resistant shirts and the employees purchase their own fire resistant pants. There was no second. Garry will check more prices.

At 7:30 pm the Mayor declared the public hearing convened on the 95/96 budget estimate. The budget estimate was considered and no objections were received. Motion by Pitts to approve the budget and file it with the County Auditor, and to adopt a resolution entitled:

Motion by Armstrong to approve Ramon Jacobson's building permit for a room addition and Tom Purdy's building permit for a pole barn, garage and back porch if they conform to code. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

John Fox of Blacktop Service discussed the street work to be done this year with the Council. The cost of seal coat will be the same as last year and the cost of hot mix will be about \$2 cheaper. Some kind of cost sharing agreement will be made with the Co-op to fix the street there. Motion by Armstrong to have Blacktop Service do the streets and to have John Fox give some suggestions for which streets need work. Seconded by Pitts. Carried unanimously. The Council plans to spend app. \$30,000 - \$35,000.

Motion by Armstrong to take applications for summer help. Garry will hire two applicants at \$5.50 per hour.

Brad Bax spoke with the council about the terms for the contract for the sale of the property to the east of City Hall. Motion by Armstrong to accept \$1000 for the property for Bax to build a car wash, subject to approval of Council after a Public Hearing. Seconded by Pitts. Carried unanimously.

A tree is to be cut down at the cemetery and it was asked if the brush could be put in our brush pile. The Council feels the brush pile is to be used only by residents of Fontanelle.

Closing of 7th St. between Main and Scott was discussed. No decision was reached.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Garry asked to attend a 4 day school in Ames for underground distribution form May 9 - 12. Motion by Armstrong to have Garry attend this school. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

An ad is to be placed in the paper for the taking of sealed bids for the dump truck, blade and sander that City will be selling. The bids will be opened at the May meeting.

Vicki Mensing wants to put in a drainage tube on the south side of her house on Maple St. The City will install the tube and two drop inlets.

A request by Keith Taylor to change one of his meters to residential was discussed. The Council didn't have enough information from the requesting party to make a decision and requests him to attend a Council meeting before any change can take place.

Garry has been looking for a steel roller for patching streets. He hasn't been able to find one yet but will keep looking.

Protective clothing was discussed. OSHA approved shirts and pants are needed for working on electricity. Motion by Thompson to have the City purchase 5 shirts each for Garry, Dale and Craig to get them started. There was no second.

Motion by Armstrong to have the City purchase 5 shirts each for Garry, Dale and Craig of the fire retardant material, but after this purchase, the City will pay only the fire retardant cost. Seconded by Pitts. Carried unanimously.

Lois asked to purchase a different typewriter. She is to get the Xerox repair phone number and check the cost of fixing the City's. Also, she is to check the cost of a used typewriter.

Melvin also asked to have the standard operating procedure amended to include semi-automatics. Order policy #10 is to include 40 caliber. Motion by Pitts to amend the standard operating procedure to include semi-automatics and 40 caliber. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

Clint gave an update on collections turned over to him.

Motion by Armstrong to adjourn. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.
