Departmental reports were given.

Garry informed the Council that the transformer went bad at the substation. The approximate cost of having it repaired and rewound will be \$18,000 to \$20,000. Also, we will need to replace a part with the REC tie line.

The electric project is going as planned. The bid letting for materials could be in August. A special meeting may be called for for approval of this bid letting. Garry will call DGR and set up a date.

Gail Young needs to finish the sewer to the new shop, Garry will call him again.

Fred Burcham needs more dirt at the drop inlet the city put in recently.

Mel presented his monthly reports. He also informed the Council that he has had the qualification for his semi-automatic weapon. An update shcool will be held at the academy later. Mel asked about fixing the slab.

Lois asked the Council about paying the posse for helping with the 4th celebration. Motion by Pitts to pay \$125. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously.

The east side of the square will be roped off for the fireworks on Saturday night, July 8.

Curt Dieren of DGR explained to the Council what has been done and what is left to be done before a bid letting for contracting the electric project can be approved. The City is to buy the materials for the project. Questions were asked and Mr. Dieren answered them. If the materials can be delivered, the contractors bid letting will be with the north section to be completed by the end of this year and with the south section to be done in the spring, with an alternate bid for completion of both sections in 1996.

Motion by Tiedeman to approve a bid letting for materials for both sections at one time. Seconded by Armstrong. Carried unanimously. The date for opening the bids will be August 10 at 2:00 pm. Garry will open and record the bids at this time. It was decided to postpone the regular meeting in August until August 14, when the contracting for materials will be awarded, thus saving having to have a special meeting. It was also decided to have a liquidated damages clause included in the contractor bid letting of \$200 a day.

Denny Reha of the Adair County Sanitary Landfill explained to the Council more about the toxic waste clean-up. Motion by Armstrong to pledge 50¢ per household to this project. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.
