Lois presented a thank you from Brad Honl at the Good Samaritan Center for the street work done in front of them.

Departmental reports were given.

Garry informed the Council that the insurance company will pay only \$5742 for damages to the back of the City Hall building. The Council will accept this amount.

A couple of estimates for repairing the back of the City Hall were viewed. It was decided that Garry and Loyal Goff will talk to these construction companies and also another one who is interested, and will make a decision so work can commence soon.

An easement with the Good Samaritan Center for access to the new line that will be put in was presented.

Allowing a handicapped parking space at the Fontanelle Medical Clinic was discussed. It was decided that a need will have to be shown before it will be allowed, since there is a handicapped accessible ramp to the street.

It was decided to store the street sweeper for awhile and find out about selling it for iron.

The fire bar on the phone has been discontinued since all calls now go directly to the Sheriff's office.

Some discussion ensued on whether the siren should continue to be blown. The Fire Department will discuss it further.

The inspection by the State Health Dept. in August went well and our department is qualified for two more years.

The Fire Department had an in-service meeting with the Good Samaritan Center. They gave the employees of the GSC training on fire extinguishers.

The Bridgewater and Fontanelle Fire Departments are co-participating in a promotional effort with Energizer batteries. Everyone is asked to drop off the UPC code from any Energizer batteries at businesses in town where these batteries are purchased in a box for this purpose. The departments can get training materials, fire alarms and other things in return for this participation.

This winter, the department may paint the water tanker.
