Pay request #2 from Nikkel & Associates was presented for the work completed thus far, in the amount of \$12,735.44. Motion by Thompson to have the Mayor sign the three (3) copies of the request and to have the Clerk issue a check in that amount. Seconded by Johanson. Carried unanimously. Garry is to check with DGR about change orders.

Motion by Cummins to approve the committee appointments as written by the Mayor. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

The City attorney informed the Council that a new company will purchase the cable TV franchise. The Council will have to approve this change in franchise.

Lois showed the Council a letter from the DOT stating that a parcel of land will be sold that is adjacent to the City limits. Lois is to send a letter stating interest in this land.

Garry informed the Council that drug and alcohol testing will be starting soon for our employees with CDL's. IAMU has a group, called DATA, that the City can join for \$50 with a cost of lab fees for the testing extra. Motion by Cummins to join DATA. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

An amendment to our contract with WAPA was discussed. This amendment extends our contract until 2020, but will also reduce our allocation up to 4%. Motion by Goff to approve the amendment after Clint has read and approved it. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Garry reported that the companies he called about fixing the digger derrick and small basket truck had returned his calls. Only one company would even work on the digger derrick and gave an estimate of \$13,800 for work on the boom only. Two companies gave estimates for the small basket truck. The Council told Garry to check prices for a used digger derrick with a warranty.

Motion by Cummins to send Dale to an electric metering school. in Ankeny, Jan. 16-18 for \$125. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Garry is to check the snow plows available from the state as soon as they are ready. The cost of the plow will be \$450.

Mel presented his monthly reports.

Motion by Cummins to adjourn. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.
