Garry asked to attend an OSHA Compliance workshop on May 1 at Atlantic. The cost is \$125. Motion by Thompson to have Garry attend this workshop. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.

No more digger derrick trucks have been located.

An employee drug & alcohol abuse policy will be put on the agenda for next month.

Mel presented his monthly report. Also, Mel is to look into the cost of new and used scrambled radios. He is to check with a couple of officers who might be willing to work part time.

Lois showed the Council a complaint about the tornado siren not covering the whole town. The complaint is to be forwarded to the fire department.

The Council decided to have the office closed on April 18 while Lois attends the IMFOA meeting in Des Moines.
