Motion by Thompson to approve a building permit for Mike Sickles for an addition if it conforms to code. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously.

Rick Allely, the director of West Central I-80 Development, visited with the Council about what the development has been doing, and possible things like a comprehensive plan and tax increment financing, that the City can do to encourage building homes.

At 7:30 p.m. a public hearing was convened to hear objections to a proposed ordinance changing the regular meeting to the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. No citizens were present to state objections. Motion by Cummins that the rule that an Ordinance must be received and filed at two meetings prior to the meeting when final action is taken, or if published in summary be received and filed at one meeting prior to the meeting of final action, be dispensed with and move for the adoption of this ordinance. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously. Roll was called and the following voted AYE: Thompson, Johnson and Cummins. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and adopted as:

#### ORDINANCE 145

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 1992, BY AMENDING 17.04(1) TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL ON THE SECOND MONDAY OF EACH MONTH RATHER THAN THE FIRST MONDAY OF EACH MONTH AND TO CONVENE AT 7:00 P.M. RATHER THAN 7:30 P.M.

John Fox of Blacktop Service talked with the Council about working on the streets. Johnson and Cummins, along with Garry, will check the streets to decide which ones will be worked on this year. Motion by Thompson to authorize the committee final approval on which streets will be done. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.

A Clean-up day was discussed. Motion by Cummins to set Saturday June 8 as clean-up day for Fontanelle, and to put an ad in the paper informing the citizens of this. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

The Council received a proposal from Creston Sanitation regarding recycling bins. The cost would be \$125.00 per load. Motion by Cummins to go ahead with the Creston Recycling bins. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

An employee substance abuse policy was discussed. A copy of the County policy is to be sent to the Councilmen for review before the next meeting.

The priority list from SICOG for 1996-2006 was discussed.

The DOT land purchase was discussed. Nothing has been heard from the DOT. The Mayor will call David Weigel with the DOT for an update.

Motion by Thompson to have the Mayor sign the maintenance agreement with the DOT for care of the highway. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.

At 8:00 p.m. a public hearing was convened to hear objections to amending the budget \$1000 in the Human Development program. No citizens were present to state objections. Motion by Cummins to approve this amendment of the budget and to move for the adoption of a resolution allowing this. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously. Roll was called and the following voted AYE; Thompson, Johnson and Cummins. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the resolution adopted as:

#### RESOLUTION 96.3

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CURRENT BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1996.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Garry reported that there is a digger derrick in Nebraska for \$20,000. Cummins mentioned 4 or 5 auctions coming up in May and June where there will be some of these trucks. Garry is to go to Nebraska to look at this truck.

The bucket truck was inspected. The only problem was a leaf spring that was broken.

Mel presented his monthly reports.

The three Greenfield officers have expressed an interest in working part time to cover for Mel when he is off duty or on vacation. They require \$8 per hour. Motion by Thompson to hire these officers to fill in one night a week for a month's trial period. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously. During vacation or when Mel is sick, they can work according to a schedule that Mel will provide.
