Motion by Cummins to approve Pay Request #5 to Nikkel & Associates, for \$13,695.88 for the work done in June on the electric project. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to delay the date of penalty to be imposed until after July 26, 1996. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. A letter to Nikkel & Associates is to be sent informing them of the date the penalty will be imposed.

Motion by Cummins to approve Dale Sickles building permit for a garage. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. Motion by Thompson to approve Don Downing's building permit for an addition of a sun room. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Gary Queck spoke with the Council about accessing the sewer line at the town shop lot for a camper dumping station. The cost of the materials could be paid for by donations and the labor would be done by the town. Thompson and Cummins, who are on the sewer committee, will look at the proposed spot and give a report at the next meeting.

Motion by Cummins to grant a variance to the code to Ed Friot, who wants to remove a section of sidewalk and plant shrubs and trees on the square. Friot will be allowed to have a 6 foot concrete sidewalk

and plantings. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.

Doug Christenson and Ed Friot complained about someone dumping grease in the alley behind Becky Boes' beauty shop. Also, open barrels with grease in them which could be a hazard to children. They feel there is inadequate police protection. Both men's homes had been vandalized within minutes of each other. The Mayor promised to look into these and other complaints and is taking the matter under advisement.

Milo Petersen and Gene Held had talked to the Council about building an addition to the fire station on the south side for storage. Plans and costs will be looked into by Milo and Gene and will be reported on at the next meeting, where it will be put on the agenda again.

Motion by Cummins to approve a proposed resolution setting the salaries of the employees. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

RESOLUTION SETTING THE SALARIES OF APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE FOR FISCAL YEAR 1996/97.

There was good response to the notice in the paper about mowing but a few ignored the notice. A list of names and addresses of properties will be given to the city attorney to send abatement notices.

Departmental reports were given and correspondence read.

Garry showed the Council a complaint taken about the electric project causing damage to a sidewalk. This complaint is to be included in the letter to Nikkel & Assoc.

Charles Cree-Anthony wants his drive flaired from the street to the garage. He must talk to the street company.

Emilie Kingery has two trees on the parking that need removed. The City will cut down the trees and Emilie has someone to remove them and do the clean-up.

The County will have an auction in the fall to sell vehicles. They will allow the City to sell any of our used vehicles at this auction. More details will have to be learned before deciding if the City will sell at this auction or some other way.

Mel presented his police reports. The new car is here and has been striped, but the radio hasn't been heard about, so the new car is not in use yet.

Lois has looked at one computer software package. She will get in touch with at least one more company and report costs and efficiency to the Council.

The auditor will be here Monday, July 15, to begin the annual audit.

Motion by Goff to adjourn. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.
