Motion by Cummins to approve a proposed resolution setting the salaries of the employees. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

Mel presented his police reports. The new car is here and has been striped, but the radio hasn't been heard about, so the new car is not in use yet.

Lois has looked at one computer software package. She will get in touch with at least one more company and report costs and efficiency to the Council.

The auditor will be here Monday, July 15, to begin the annual audit.

Motion by Cummins to approve the new members of the Library board. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. The new members are: Mary Miller, Marilyn Jacobson and Scott Homan.

Susan Olesen spoke to the Council about a 'School to Work' program to help kids prepare to enter the work force. The Council was also invited to a community meeting September 12 at noon in Greenfield.

Milo Petersen brought a new estimate of an addition to the south side of the fire station to be used for storage. The Lions Club will pay for 50% of the materials. The labor would be on a volunteer basis. Motion by Dukes to approve this addition with the City paying the other 50% of the materials, app. \$2400, upon approval of the Summerset trustees. Decoded by Cummins. Carried unanimously. This proposal will be put on the agenda for the Fire & Rescue Management meeting later this month.

Mrs. Ed Friot attended the meeting to inquire what was being done about the grease dumping, police protection and the status of the investigation of the break-ins of last month. Melvin said the investigation is still underway. The Council told Melvin to be sure to call for backup when needed.

Departmental reports were given.

Garry informed the Council of the need for new tires for two of the pickups. The Council told him to go ahead and order them.

Garry also informed the Council that the wastewater tests are going to have to be done by a certified lab by Oct. 1. Garry and Dale are to have our lab certified by the DNR. This will cost app. \$300 every other year.

Mel presented his police reprot. He informed the Council that he had passed his weapon qualification.

Also, the car radio and lights will be installed August 13. The old radio will be kept for backups.

Motion by Cummins to adjourn. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.
