Motion by Dukes to approve a building permit for Daniel Girdner for a shop extension to his garage, if it conforms to code. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve a building permit for Cynthia Cogdell for a mobile home with deck and a shed, if it conforms to code. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.

Alan Samson with the DOT in Atlantic, met with the Council regarding the possible purchase of the state land west of town where the trees have been planted. The price of purchase would be \$3000, which the town can make in four annual payments of \$750 per year. The City could also lease the property for a two year period at \$200 per year. After discussion, the Council said they would decide at the next regular meeting, which will be held on Tuesday, November 12, 1996.

Deb Dukes spoke to the Council about the slab and community service. Departmental reports were given.

Garry had figured the approximate cost of installing electric service and a number of multiple outlets to the triangle of land west of town so that the trees could be decorated for Christmas by the Enterprise Club, Lions Club and Women's Club. The cost to the City would run approximately \$2200. Motion by Goff to acquire the triangle as a gift or at the lowest price possible and to have the electric work done on the whole property. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Thompson to have the park, library and water tower area sprayed for broadleaf control this fall at a cost of \$261. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes for the City not to remove any more trees for property owners. They are to maintain all trees on their property and parking. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

Melvin submitted his monthly reports. Abatement notices were discussed. A list of nuisances will be submitted to the City attorney for notices to be sent.

The Mayor showed the Council information on heavy duty push mowers. They will be discussed at the next meeting.

Motion by Thompson to have the Mayor sign a proclamation declaring October 15, 1996, as White Cane Safety Day. Seconded by Johnson. Carried unanimously.
