township citizens; and Steve Faga, Dale Sickles and Denny Sickles from the fire department.

Steve Faga reported to the sub-committee on the condition of the current truck. The main problem is a primer valve, which no replacement parts can be found for. The truck is over 30 years old and parts for it will become increasingly difficult to obtain. There is the possibility that the pumps and lines could freeze during extreme cold. The truck has also vapor locked once before.

The department is to present some bid spec sheets for inspection. As of this time, there seems to be no grants available. Possibly

next year the IDED could have something.

Milo Petersen and couple of the firemen are going to talk to some departments in the surrounding areas that have bought trucks to see where they were purchased and how they were financed.

It was decided that the truck will probably be paid for from

donations and fund raisers.

Motion by Herr to authorize the sub-committee to proceed with looking into a fire truck purchase and to approve fund raising efforst after bids have been gotten from companies selling trucks. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

It could take up to a year to receive a new fire truck after it is ordered.
