Motion by Cummins to approve a building permit for Carol Nielsen for a deck if it conforms to code. Seconded by Thompson. Carried unanimously.

The employee policy had been reviewed prior to the meeting by the Council members. No changes were called for. Motion by Dukes to adopt this employee policy. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously.

At 7:30 p.m. the Mayor called the Public Hearing convened. This hearing was to have the second reading of a proposed ordinance to enact a curfew. The Clerk read the proposed ordinance. The Mayor then opened the meeting for discussion. Sherri Warrior and her son Ryan were the only residents present. Mrs. Warrior asked some questions and stated that she feels this issue is a parental responsibility not a City one and wishes more parents would take this responsibility seriously. Ryan also asked some questions. Motion by Cummins to set the third and final reading for the next regular meeting on Nov. 10, 1997. The public hearing will be held at 7:30 p.m.

The park restrooms were discussed. Goff had a rough sketch of a handicap accessible building. It was decided to insulate and heat the building for use year round from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Goff and Dukes are to work on plans for a new building. The old structure will be removed soon.

Departmental reports were given.

Corey presented his monthly reports. Corey presented six items he feels need to be purchased: a crystal for the radio for scrambling, flashers for the car, a shotgun, a portable breath tester, winter clothing and a storage box for the car. Motion by Dukes to allow the clothing purchase. This motion was amended to include the flasher lights and the shotgun after Dukes checks for a cheaper price. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. The scrambling crystal will be checked with the insurance agent to see if it was covered when payed for the claim on the car that was destroyed. The breath tester will be considered after Corey's academy training.

Remodeling of the City Hall to add two more offices for the police dept. and utilities dept. was discussed and will be looked into.

Garry had received a letter from the EPA regarding some old capacitors sent to a company app. 10 years ago that has gone bankrupt. The City may have to pay a share of the cleanup costs. Garry is to check with the League and APPA to see if they can do anything to assist us.

Garry also reported that the gas hanging heater at the shop has a crack in the exchange. He is to look into the cost of an infra-red heater.

Garry is also to look at a John Deere 200 tractor with a clam bucket.

Lois reported that she has had training on the accounting software in Ankeny on Oct. 13 and 14. She also asked that Vision Municipal be hired to install a backup system with tape drive. Motion by Thompson to have this backup system installed. Seconded by Goff. Carried with Cummins voting Nay.
