ORDINANCE 148

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, 1992, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION, 46.02, PERTAINING TO CURFEW.

A discussion on a nine year old judgement ensued. The orginal judgement was for \$570.08 plus a filing fee of \$34.54. Interest was charged at 10% per year. Due to special circumstances, a motion was made by Dukes to have only the original charge of \$604.62 collected and to forego the interest charges and settle for \$610.00. Seconded by Thompson. Carried with Thompson, Dukes, Goff and Holan voting AYE and Cummins abstaining.

At 8:00 p.m. the Mayor convened the Public Hearing on the proposed ordinance closing the east half of the alley between Main and Scott and 5th and 6th. Motion by Cummins to suspend and dispense with the laws and rules providing that ordinances shall be fully and distinctly read on three different meetings, and that the proposed ordinance be placed on its last reading and to adopt the proposed ordinance. Seconded by Goff. Carried unanimously. Whereupon, the Mayor declared this ordinance duly passed and adopted as:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE VACATION OF THAT PORTION OF THE EAST-WEST ALLEY DESCRIBED AS COMMENCING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF LOT SEVEN (7), THENCE EAST TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF LOT EIGHT (8), THENCE NORTH TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF LOT ONE (1), THENCE WEST TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF LOT TWO (2), THENCE SOUTH TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, ALL IN BLOCK 15 OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN OF FONTANELLE, ADAIR COUNTY, IOWA.

More radios for the vehicles were discussed. The possibility of personal radios to be carried or possibly cellular phones to be carried was also an option. Garry is to get prices for cell phone and calling packages for the next meeting. Also making a monthly allowance for personal cell phones was discussed.
