Motion by Glassell to sign the permits necessary if NewCom agrees to three additional stipulations to this agreement. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously. The city attorney will add thses stipulations and send them to NewCom.

A City/County joint cost savings meeting will be attended by Councilman Cummins. Motion by Dukes to commit up to \$100 to join if Cummins is in agreement after this meeting. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to get firm costs from Blacktop Service for asphalt and sealcoat. If the cost doesn't exceed a certain percent increase from last year, the City will enter into a contract with Blacktop Service. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

The park bathrooms were discussed. The prices on fixtures will remain the same as quoted until the 1st of May. It was decided to have two stools in the womens restroom and one stool and a urinal in the mens. It will be insulated and have steel walls inside and out.
