The Council discussed closing 6th Street north of the Evelyn Purdy residence. Motion by Jaschke to not close this street. Seconded by Holan. Carried with Dukes voting Nay. This street will be maintained farther north for access to her garage.

A discussion of nuisances was held.

The vacuum at the community center needs to be replaced. Glassell will get some prices of heavy duty vacuums and purchase one if under \$500.

The Council suggested that part of the cleaning duties be extended to include changing the furnace filter at the community center monthly. Departmental reports were given.

Craig asked that Jack be sent to an overhead electric school in Ames September 16-18. Motion by Jaschke to approve Jack's attendance at the school. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

Craig and Jack will be putting the electric to the temporary school with the assistance of the REC this week.

The pits at the water plant are due to be cleaned soon. Craig asked about renting or borrowing a hotsy to power wash the walls of the pits. The Council recommended getting prices for the purchase of a hotsy.

Dan Marnin and August Gross will have water service run to them at approximately the same time when a time can be set up with the company doing the boring.

A hole in Maple St. keeps getting deeper. Rock has been added. It is thought that the sewer could be the problem. The possibility of exposing the sewer line and doing an exploratory dig was discussed. Cummins will have a backhoe available for the next few days.

The ditches need cleaned at the sewer lagoon.

Tim Held plans to remove the sidewalk going south from his apartment property and replacing it with a smaller one.

Corey presneted his police reports. He reported that he had purchased the approved equipment.

Lois informed the Council that John Fox of Blacktop Service had stopped and that he would like a map of the streets to be done this year. Fox needs to talk with Cummins about the streets to be done. A map will be sent to Fox.

Motion by Glassell to adjourn. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.
