

The B-F Little League asked for a donation to help with costs incurred by the volunteers. Motion by Cummins to donate \$250 from the electric utility to the Little League. Seconded by Holan. Carried unanimously.

Councilman Cummins received permission to go to the County with a request to dam the river to raise the water level at the well. He will discuss this with Greg Shawler of H R Green before if possible. Nothing will be decided at this meeting but Councilman Cummins will report back to the Council at the next meeting.

The check from SIMECA for development was discussed. It was decided to give the Lions' Club \$1000, the Greater Fontanelle Community Betterment Foundation \$1000 and the Enterprise Club \$380.40.

Motion by Glassell to authorize the Mayor to sign the CDBG grant application forms. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously.

The discussion on code questions will be postponed until the next regular meeting. Lois will make copies of all the questions the codification people have and deliver them to the Councilmembers prior to the meeting.

A discussion on clean-up and nuisance abatement was tabled until March 22, 1999, when there will be a special meeting to discuss this issue along with wages and insurance.

David Griffith came to the meeting to inquire about what was discussed earlier regarding the parking in the alley behind his business. The Council repeated their suggestions and also suggested impounding vehicles that have not been picked up due to inability of the customer to pay their bill.

Councilmen Cummins and Holan will look at the streets and report back at the next regular meeting.

Corey presented his monthly police report.

With the snow, he has received some complaints about snowmobiles. Also, discussed was parking, handicap parking and possible designated truck parking.

The light bar has been fixed.

The possibility of issuing seat belt tickets was raised.

Corey has also started training with Greenfield for safety purposes.

Craig reported that he had received quotes for uniform rental from ARAMark. The question was raised if there was an initial charge for this rental service. Craig is to check and report at the next meeting. Also, he is to call Red Wing to inquire about plastic toed boots.

Craig also informed the Council that work at the school would be commencing soon. A substantial expense is to be expected for transformers and the like. Also, the water and sewer lines will be changed.

The pumps at the well continue to lock up. Craig asked if the Council wated a study done by the engineers on preventing the iron building up on the pumps. When Councilman Cummins talks to Greg Shawler and has him look at the river, Craig will have Greg also look at the pumps.

Water pressure at the Good Samaritan Center was discussed.

Motion by Jaschke to adjourn. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

March 22, 1999

The Fontanelle City Council met in special session on Monday, March 22, 1999, at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Jacobson calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Dukes, Glassell, Holan, Cummins and Jaschke who arrived late. Absent: None.

Motion by Cummins to approve the agenda. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to approve Calvin Edwards building permit for a house if it conforms to code requirements. Seconded by Holan. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to authorize the Mayor to sign an entrance permit from the Iowa - DOT for Calvin to construct a driveway to his property from the highway. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

Kathy Alexander and Jon Niemeyer from NewPath Communications discussed with the Council the terms of renewing the cable TV franchise. Motion by Cummins to grant temporary extension of the existing franchise and accept the proposed ordinance after minor changes and subject to a Public Hearing to be held on April 12, 1999,

at 7:30 p.m. at which time the Mayor will be authorized to sign the lease agreement if the ordinance passes. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Debrea Dukes gave notice that she will no longer help with the outside work. She will continue until a replacement can be hired. She will continue to work part time in the office.

Nuisances and clean-up were discussed. Motion by Dukes to have a clean-up day on Saturday, April 17, with a rain date of Saturday, April 24. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously.

Insurance costs were discussed.

The Council talked individually with each employee regarding wages. Motion by Cummins to raise Craig's wages \$1 per hour and to designate Craig as Superintendent of Utilities; also, to raise Jack, Lois and Corey's wages \$.50 per hour. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Jaschke to raise Debrea's wages \$.50 per hour and to raise Sarah's wages \$.25 per hour. Seconded by Cummins. Carried with Dukes abstaining.

Councilman Cummins reported that he had attended the meeting with the County regarding dam cost sharing. the County is willing to sign up for this program.

Corey is to attend a planning meeting on Thursday, March 25, at 11:00 a.m. regarding the Juvenile Accountability Incentive block Grant.

Craig reported that the well motor has needed to be rebuilt three times recently. Motion by Jaschke to order a new motor for \$1012. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously.

Craig has gotten bids from suppliers on transformers, elbows, pedestals, wire, boring, etc. for electrical supplies needed at the school. The school's engineers are hoping for temporary hook-up by the first of April. Craig is to take the responsibility for getting the best prices for the earliest delivery dates.

All cotton uniforms and plastic toed shoes were discussed. Motion by Dukes to purchase no more than one pair of boots per year per full time employee and also to enter into a rental contract with ARAMark for uniforms with the City of Fontanelle emblem on them. Seconded by Holan. Carried unanimously.

Bids for hand rails at the water plant were viewed. Motion by Dukes to hire Fox Welding at \$1077 to install said railing. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.

Corey would like to carry the spare cellular phone. Motion by Cummins to allow this. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

Lois reported that Melvin has some donations for the plaque for Delmer Miller Park. The City will accept these donations and purchase the plaque.

Motion by Cummins to adjourn. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 12, 1999, at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Jacobson calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Dukes, Glassell, Jaschke and Cummins. Absent: Holan.
