

Motion by Jaschke to have the Fontanelle Lions' Club named the recipient of the SIMECA donation to development. Seconded by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Greg Shawler and Chris Peterson of H R GREEN Co. discussed the sewer project with the Council. They are sending out the papers to the DNR. The bidding will be on full replacement and/or full pipe bursting. Services will be replaced to the property line. At the next meeting, the Council will set the bid letting.

No responses had been received for test wells at the water plant.

A discussion of group insurance with IAMU was tabled until the next meeting.

Changing long distance carriers was discussed. Motion by Cummins to have Lois compare carriers and select the appropriate one. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to appoint Gary Queck as its representative to the Adair County Sesquicentennial Committee. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Cummins to appoint Patty Queck as its representative to the Adair County Neighborhood Advisory Commission. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Jaschke to appoint Shirley Tannatt as its representative to the Southern Iowa Council of Governments (SICOG) board. Seconded by Cummins. Carried unanimously.

There were no new police applicants. The Council discussed the prior applicants and County protection. Corey and Chief Matthews will offer an applicant the position of Police Chief for \$22,000 per year with an undisclosed raise after he completes the academy. He will be given a \$500 sign on bonus and will sign a contract.

Departmental reports were given.

The spring IMFOA meeting will be held in April. Lois asked if both she and Deb could attend for one day session. Motion by Jaschke to allow both Lois and Debrea to attend the IMFOA meeting on April 27, 2000. Seconded by Cummins. Carried with Dukes abstaining.

Craig requested that the City hook up to the internet. Craig and Lois are to check rates when checking rates with long distance carriers.

Employee applications were reviewed. The applicant hired must be made aware that he will be sent to sewer school and then to water school. After completing the school, the applicant will be given one year to pass the tests given after schooling. If unable to qualify for the sewer license or the water license, it will constitute just cause for dismissal.

Motion by Cummins to offer the position to Jerry Zimmerline at \$9.00 per hour and to send Jerry to school for license as soon as possible. SEconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

The possibility of hiring another full time employee was discussed. The City will advertise for a part-time employee (up to 32 hours a week). This could possibly work into a full time position.

Motion by Jaschke to adjourn. Seconded by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Lori Fox and Tammi Cass gave a RAGBRAI update. Lori had attended a meeting in Des Moines on Saturday. The Council had to decide on the route that RAGBRAI will take through Fontanelle. It was decided they will be directed to turn on to Main St. from 1st St., then on to 4th St. where they will turn to go back to Highway 92.

Vendors were discussed. It was decided to approve the plan for a community effort of vendors. A temporary ordinance will be put into place for that one day. The Council also approve the logo. There will need to be at least 7 more law enforcement individuals hired for that day for crowd control and other concerns.

Motion by Cummins to approve Ray Stewart's building permit for two decks. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Jaschke to set a City wide clean-up day for Saturday, April 29, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

A request to close 6th St. north of Evelyn Purdy's was discussed.

Motion by Dukes to close said street. SEconded by Glassell. Carried with jaschke voting NAY and Sickles abstaining.

Motion by Jaschke to ask the following people to accept appointment as the City's representative to the following committees and boards:

Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

It was decided that since the City will incur costs on streets in the two annexed areas, that other streets would not be worked on this year unless one was found to be in very poor shape.

Two bids had been received by H R Green to install two test wells for the City. The first bid was submitted by J & R Drilling Services, Inc. for \$7980 for both wells; plus \$400 per diem; and plus \$25 per foot if it is required to drill deeper than forty feet. The second bid was submitted by Longfellow Drilling, Inc. and is a lump sum bid of \$8750 and does not include testing or abandonment of the wells. Additionally, in the event the wells need to be drilled deeper than

forty feet, Longfellow would require \$100 per foot. On recommendation from H R Green, a motion was made by Cummins to enter into a contract with J & R Drilling Services, Inc. to drill the two test wells. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.

The City Council considered the proposed Wastewater Collection System Improvements Projects. Council Member Cummins introduced the resolution next hereinafter set out and moved for its adoption. Seconded by Council Member Jaschke. After due consideration thereof by the Council, the Mayor put the question on the motion and the roll being called, the following named Council Members voted AYE: Cummins, Sickles, Jaschke, Glassell and Dukes. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the said motion duly carried and the said resolution adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION 2000.8

TO PROVIDE FOR A NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, FORM OF CONTRACT AND ESTIMATE OF COST FOR THE WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, AND THE TAKING OF BIDS THEREFOR.

Departmental reports were heard.

Craig reported to the Council that only one application had been received for part time employment. After discussion, a motion was made by Cummins to offer full employment to one of the recent applicants for \$9 per hour. Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.

Craig asked if the Council wanted a 2" water line and fire hydrant or a 3/4" service line put in for Stacie Christensen. A loop for the southern annexed area was discussed. It was decided to have the 2" line installed unless the cost was excessively more than the 3/4" line would be.

An underground electric distribution workshop will be held in Ankeny from May 16 - 19, 2000. Motion by Glassell to send Jerry Zimmerline. Seconded by Cummins Carried unanimously. The cost will be \$125.

GTE requested permission to put in a new line to the Bank. The Council instructed Craig to request no open trenching.

Internet access was discussed. The cost would be \$120 for six months with a \$20 activation fee. Motion by Glassell to subscribe to the internet Seconded by Dukes. Carried with Cummins voting NAY.

Todd Lewis, the new City police officer, met the full Council. He has only been working for one week, thus had no formal report.

Motion by Jaschke to purchase a new vacuum for the City Hall. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Lois is to get bids for steam cleaning the community center carpet.

A request for funds for the Little League was table until the next meeting.

Motion by Cummins to adjourn Seconded by Jaschke. Carried unanimously.
