

City of Fontanelle  
February 12, 2001

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. at the Fontanelle City Hall with Mayor Homan Calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Dukes, Glassell, Jaschke, Sickles and Cummins. Absent: None.

Motion by Glassell to approve agenda. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

The Library Committee gave their annual report. The budget was passed around. They reported that the Library is now accredited with all the staff having received their certification. They thanked the city crew for the great job they have done with the snow removal. They also have new hours which are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday 1:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., Saturday 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., Closed Sunday and Wednesday.

The Emmanuel Lutheran Church talked to the Council about the safe house project that the Luther League is doing. They have talked to the Family Crisis Unit in Greenfield and other officials about it. Tim Ostroski with SICOG says there might be funding for it.

Tim Ostroski with SICOG was next on the agenda. He gave the Council an update on the EWAG grant. The Council read a resolution to participate in the planning and development programs of the Southern Iowa Council of Governments. There will be a public hearing held on it March 12, 2001 to receive input from the public on it. Tim has the Council fill out a Comprehensive Economic Development Annual Update for Economic Development Region 14 - Local Priorities list.

Paul Zietlow talked to the Council about Summerset Estates.

The 2001 city budget was presented. Motion by Cummins to accept the current budget. Seconded by Dukes. Carried unanimously. A Public Hearing was set for March 12, 2001 to receive input from the public.

The Welcome signs on both sides of town were discussed. Council members are going to check with the local clubs in town to see if any are interested in doing the project.

The employee's wages were tabled at this time. Employee health insurance was discussed. Insurance rates increased 12% on March 1, 2001. Council members and employees discussed different alternatives to look into. Glassell made a motion to switch to PPO plan and \$250.00 deductiblbe as long as all employee's wre in agreement. Seconded by Cummins. Motion Carried. Mayor Homan will write a from letter for all employees to sign.

Water and Sewer rate increases were discussed with Craig and the Council. Rates have not gone up since 1984. The Council acted on a proposed increase. Motion by Glassell and seconded by Jaschke to have a Public Hearing March 12, 2001, at 7:30 p.m. to receive input from the public. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve the minutes. Seconded by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Sickles to approve clerk's report. Seconded by Glassell. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve bills. Seconded by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

March 12, 2001

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7:00 P.M. at the Fontanelle City Hall with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Dukes, Glassell, Jaschke, Sickles and Cummins. Absent: None.

Motion by Glassell to amend the agenda. Seconded by Cummins. Paul Zietlow and SICOG resolution was added to agenda.

Council discussed the sewer complaint. The home owner was present to present a list of the damages. Council decided to wait until they hear from the insurance company. The Council will contact the homeowner when they hear from insurance.

Paul Zietlow questioned the percentages given in the paperwork from Josten. Council and Zietlow discussed it and decided to give it to the County Attorney to look over.

At 7:30 P.M. a Public Hearing was held to hear objections to a proposed ordinance raising the water and sewer rates. One citizen was present to discuss the increase. Motion by Cummins to suspend the rule stating an ordinance must be received and filed at two meetings prior to the meeting when final action is taken, or if published in summary be received and filed at one meeting prior to the meeting of final action be dispensed with and move for the adoption of this ordinance. Seconded by Jaschke. Roll call was called and the following voted AYE: Dukes, Glassell, Jaschke, Sickles, and Cummins. NAY: None. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and duly adopted as:
