** Approximately Fifty percent (50%) of the project has been

completed.

- ** The need for the project was determined following the completion of local meetings.
- ** The total CDBG contract amount is \$250,000.
- ** No problems have occured (except for normal winter/spring delays in the project.)
- ** Through Monday, May 14, 2001, \$163,042. in Federal (CDBG) funds has been requested and \$161,860. expended.
- ** No households were displaced, or relocated, to an improved dwelling unit as the result of this project.
- ** The city's contract with IDED expires July, 2001.
- ** No interpreter was at the meeting and none was required.
- ** Unnecessary damage to resedents' property will be reported to the city hall.

There were no other comments, and the hearing was closed.
