City of Fontanelle June 14, 2004

Scott Homan, Mayor

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session with Mayor Scott Homan calling the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Council members present were: Glassell, Dukes, Sickles and Newton. Absent: Baudler.

Motion by Sickles to approve the agenda as presented with the following addition: police car outside day/night. Second by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve the cigarette permits for Casey's General Store and the Fontanelle Bar. Newton seconded by the motion, carried unanimously.

Doug Davidson from SICOG presented a draw down for Project #7 in the amount of \$11,223.00. Motion by Glassell to approve the draw down as presented. Second by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Larry Warrior was present to request the council consider ways to widen the alley he lives on. He states traffic is very heavy and speed is a concern. The street committee will inspect the alley and this item will be placed on next month's agenda.

John Baudler was present to discuss his proposed water line extension to the north. Discussed ways to distribute costs evenly to customers wishing to connect to the line in the future.

Craig reported on the progress on extending the water and sewer line to Patty Jacobson's new house. The weather has been causing problems, but pipe has been delivered and he hopes to begin work this week. Cummins Construction will use their track hoe to help.

Information regarding the proposed local option sales sent by the county auditor was reviewed. Glassell made a motion to have a resolution ready at the July council meeting approving the local option sales tax being brought to a vote with 100% of proposed taxes being used for capital improvements. Second by Newton. Carried unanimously.

The police report provided by Nathan Byerly was reviewed. Homan reported he has received a suggestion from a citizen that the police car be parked outside during the day to help slow traffic down. After some discussion, it was decided that this would not be feasible.

Gary Queck has relayed a request from Curt Queck that they are allowed to purchase a light and have the city hang the light on a street light pole to illuminate their flag. After some discussion regarding liability issues, Newton made a motion to deny this request. Sickles seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Susan presented some figures regarding the water fund. It is approximately \$50,000.00 in the red at this time and we are losing an average of \$530.00 per month. After reviewing the figures and discussing other city's charges, Newton made a motion to change the ordinance to raise the minimum to \$15.00 for the first 1000 gallons and charge \$4.00 per thousand gallons after that. Customers outside the city limits would be billed at 125% of this charge. Dukes seconded the motion. Carried unanimously. Susan will contact the city attorney to amend the ordinance and will schedule a public hearing on this matter for the July council meeting.

Craig presented a list of electrical outages caused by bad wire for the last several years. We have identified a section of wire between the school and the Coop, which needs replaced. Craig discussed probable costs for this and was given approval to proceed.

Motion by Glassell to approve the minutes, list of bills and the clerk's report. Sickles seconded
