City of Fontanelle November 8, 2004

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session with Mayor Scott Homan calling the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Council members present were: Glassell, Sickles, Baudler, Dukes and Newton. Absent: none.

Motion by Newton to approve the agenda as presented. Second by Dukes. Carried

unanimously.

Doug Davidson, SICOG representative, presented Pay Request #12 in the amount of \$39,167.00. Motion by Glassell to approve the pay request, second by Baudler. Carried unanimously. Doug reported he hopes to have enough funds remaining for two more homes and he has enough applications previously submitted.

Mike Cass, Larry Raper, Ron Reed, Carole Brown, Ramon Jacobson and Dennis Parkis were present representing Summerset Enterprises. They reported that the shell of the grocery store building is to be started later in November and they will proceed as far as possible as long as funds are available. They are asking for the city's support in the form of letters for grant applications and assistance with utilities being installed. The council is proposing underwriting the costs of installing utilities up to a cap of \$5000.00. If the grocery store is sold to a private individual before five years have passed, the cost of the utilities will be prorated and reimbursed to the city. This item will be placed on the agenda for December's council meeting to allow for public input before a final decision is made.

The Raasch family would like to donate a tree to replace the dying tree in the northwest corner of the park. Discussed having the trunk of the old tree carved. The Goofy statue in the park rotted off at the base and had to be removed. Discussed if it would be cost prohibitive to try to reattach the statue to the base. Homan will get further information on both of these issues.

Discussed cleaning of the carpet in city hall. Motion by Sickles to hire Scott Crum of All-Clean to clean the carpet at a cost of \$125.00. Baudler seconded the motion. Carried unanimously.

Young Mechanical had submitted their final pay request in the amount of \$3675.00 after completing the seeding along the water line. Motion by Glassell to approve the final payment. Sickles seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Dukes, Glassell, Sickles, and Newton. Voting Nay: none. Abstaining due to conflict of interest: Baudler. Motion carried.

Paul Zietlow had written a letter regarding seeding the west bank of the new road extending 3rd Street to the north. Craig also reported a drainage problem with this new road. Motion by Dukes to seed the bank and install a tile line to alleviate the drainage problem with the work to be done in the spring. Second by Baudler. Carried unanimously.

Letter sent to Greenfield Municipal Utilities Superintendent Duane Armstead and the Greenfield Board of Trustees was reviewed.

The third and final reading of Ordinance No. 2004.01, an ordinance amending the code of the ordinances of the City of Fontanelle by adding a new chapter on the operation of golf carts in the City of Fontanelle was held. Motion by Glassell to adopt the ordinance as presented. Second by Sickles. Roll

was called with the following voting Aye: Glassell, Sickles, Newton, Baudler. Voting Nay: Dukes. Motion carried. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and adopted as:

ORDINANCE NO. 2004.01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 2002, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER ON THE OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS IN THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa

Section 1. New Chapter. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa 2002, is amended by adding a new Chapter number (74), entitled Golf Carts, which is hereby adopted to read as follows: Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to permit the operation of golf carts on certain streets and alleys in the city, as authorized by Section 321.247 of the Code of Iowa, as amended. This ordinance applied whenever a golf cart is operated on any street or alley, subject to those exceptions stated herein.

Section 3. Permit required. Each golf cart operated on City streets shall have attached to the right rear of the golf cart a special permit obtained from the City Clerk at an annual fee of \$50.00. The application for the permit shall set forth that the owner of the golf cart has liability insurance covering the golf cart in the same limits required of automobiles by chapter 321 of the Code of Iowa. This permit may be revoked by

action of the Fontanelle City Council.

Section 4. Traffic Code Applies. Every person operating a golf cart upon a street or alley shall be granted all of the rights and privileges and shall be subject to all the duties and obligations applicable to the driver of a vehicle and to the laws of the state declaring the rules of the road applicable to the driver of the vehicle, except as to those provisions which by their nature can have no application.

Section 5. Riding on Golf Carts. A person operating a golf cart shall not ride other than on a permanent regular seat attached thereto. No golf cart shall be used to carry more persons at one time that the number

for which it is designed and equipped.

Section 6. Operation Permitted. Golf carts may be operated on the street and alleys in the City, but only on the roadway or traveled portion of the streets or alleys and shall not be operated on any sidewalk. Section 7. Prohibited Streets. A golf cart shall not be operated upon Washington Street/Highway 92 and 1st Street/N72, but shall be allowed to cross those highways at or about a 90-degree angle.

Section 8. Drivers License Required. Any person operating a golf cart upon any City street or alley shall

possess a valid motor vehicle license issued by the State.

Section 9. Equipment. Golf cart operated upon any street shall be equipped with a slow-moving vehicle sign, a bicycle safety flag of Day-Glo color not less than 30 square inches in area color and extending at least 5 feet above the ground, adequate brakes in good condition, muffler properly attached and operating, and illuminated turn signals and brake lights.

Section 10. Hours of Operation. Golf carts may be operated on City streets and alleys only from sunrise

to sunset and between the months of March and October.

Section 11. Penalty. Violation of this chapter shall be punishable by a scheduled fine of \$50.00 plus court costs and all applicable surcharges.

Section 12. Repealer. All ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict with the provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 13. Severability Clause. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 14. When Effective. This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication as required by law.

Passed and approved this 8th day of November 2004.
