The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Baudler, Glassell, Sickles and Newton. Absent: Dukes.

Motion by Baudler to approve the agenda as presented. Motion seconded by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

At 7 p.m. a Public Hearing was held concerning the budget for fiscal year 2005/2006. No one was presents to comment on the proposed budget. It was moved by Glassell and seconded by Sickles the budget be adopted as published. On roll call vote the following votes were recorded. Ayes: Baudler, Glassell, Sickles, and Newton. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared this resolution duly passed and adopted as:

Reviewed a letter from SICOG requesting regional priorities for the City of Fontanelle. Priorities were rated and will be sent to Jeremy Rounds.

The Mayor signed sesquicentennial proclamation.

Reviewed a copy of a letter sent from the Adair County Board of Supervisors to the Adair County Sanitary Landfill Commission. The Board of Supervisors has voted to no longer pay the \$9.00 per capita fee for the rural residents beginning with the 2007 budget year. They wish to review the 28E agreement also. A letter will be sent to the Supervisors inviting them to attend the next city council meeting to discuss this matter.

The group health insurance plan is up for renewal. Quotes were reviewed and discussed. Motion by Baudler to renew the policy with Fortis with no changes. Glassell seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Baudler, Glassell, Sickles. Voting Nay: none. Abstaining due to conflict of interest: Newton. Motion carried.

Motion by Glassell to award the SIMECA Economic Development check in the amount of \$2,371.97 to the Fontanelle Enterprise Club. Second by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Reviewed a sample letter which will be sent to property owners who have vegetation, shrubs, etc. too close to transformers. The Iowa Utility Board requires that for safety reasons, there be an area of clearance around transformers. Letters will be sent out this month to property owners needing to clear items from around transformers.

Motion by Newton to adopt Resolution No. 2005.4. Second by Baudler. Roll was called and the following voted Aye: Baudler, Glassell, Sickles, and Newton. Voting Nay: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

The Fontanelle Fire and Rescue Management Committee met in regular session March 24, 2005 at City Hall with Mayor Scott Homan calling the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Committee members present: Ehram, Clifton Baudler, Chris Baudler, Dukes, and Mensing. Absent: Glassell.

Motion by Chris Baudler to approve the agenda as presented. Second by Dukes. Carried unanimously.

Sickles reported that the radio in the rescue unit needs replaced. They can be heard by other people, but cannot hear anyone replying. This has been causing problems on calls. He received a quote from Spring Valley Wireless for a 110 watt Motorola radio in the amount of \$2065.00 installed. Motion by Dukes to purchase a new radio for the rescue unit. Second by Chris Baudler. Carried unanimously. Sickles also reported that he is submitting another grant request for a new fire truck, and they have had 9 fire calls so far this year, which is more than they had all of last year.

Mensing made a motion to approve the financial report. Second by Clifton Baudler. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve the minutes from the November meeting. Second by Chris Baudler. Carried unanimously.

March 21, 2005

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. This meeting was postponed for one week due to a conflict. Council members present were: Dukes, Baudler, Glassell, and Sickles. Absent: Newton.

Motion by Sickles to approve the agenda with the deletion of Andy Miller's concerns regarding his alley, due to a conflict with Andy's schedule. Motion seconded by Baudler. Carried unanimously.

SICOG representative Doug Davidson presented a contract extension for the mayor to sign to allow the last two houses to be completed. Motion by Glassell for the mayor to sign a draw down in the amount of \$38,824.00. Second by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Dukes to approve a building permit for a storage building for Hamilton Sivadge. Second by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Larry Baudler, county landfill representative, Richard Dolan and Bill Lamb, county supervisors, were present to discuss the memo sent by the Adair County Supervisors. Beginning with FY07 the supervisors voted not pay the per capita fee required by the 28E agreement. Non-payment of the fees could affect their voting and dumping rights at the landfill. The supervisors believe this will encourage the landfill to become self-supporting.

The council reviewed the letter sent by Janene Burmeister regarding the vegetation policy required by the Iowa Utility Board. Janene had been asked to remove a bush planted too close to a transformer. Janene requested that the city be responsible for transplanting the bush. The city will not transplant the bush, but will remove it if it still remains after June 1st as stated in the city's notice.

The letter from the library board regarding the old fire station was reviewed.

Reviewed information regarding a proposed Southern League of Iowa Communities. Motion by Baudler to pay expenses for any council member, mayor, or city employee who wished to attend meetings. Second by Sickles. Carried unanimously. Glassell expressed an interest in attending the first meeting. Susan will send in the registration form.

Reviewed police department report prepared by Nathan Byerly. Mayor Homan reported the city would need extra certified officers present during the sesquicentennial celebration in July.
