AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLLE, IOWA, 2002, BY AMENDING SECTION 41.09 TO AMEND DISCHARGING **WEAPONS**

Be it Enacted by the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa:

Section 1. Section 41.09 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 2002 is amended by amending 41.09 as follows:

Section 41.09 Discharging Weapons

It is unlawful for a person to discharge rifles, shotguns, revolvers, pistols, guns, BB guns, pellet guns or other firearms of any kind within the City limits except by written consent of

No person shall intentionally discharge a firearm in a reckless manner.

Section 2. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this

ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Severability clause. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4. When Effective. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and

publication as provided by law.
