AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FONTANELLE, IOWA, 2002, BY AMENDING SECTION 105.05 TO CLARIFY THE RESTRICTIONS ON OPEN BURNING

Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Section 105.05 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 2002 is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

105.05 OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of rubbish, garbage, paper, construction debris, tires, plastics or any other combustible materials where the products of combustion are emitted into the open air without passing through a chimney or stack, except that open burning is permitted in the following circumstances:

1. Recreational Fires. Open fires for cooking, heating, recreation and ceremonies, provided they comply with the limits for emission of visible air contaminants established by the State Department of Natural Resources. Rubber tires shall not be burned in a recreational fire.

2. Training Fires. Fires set for the purpose of bona fide training of public or industrial employees in fire fighting methods, provided that the training fires are conducted in compliance with the rules established by the State Department of Natural Resources.

3. Supervision. Any burning within the City of Fontanelle shall be supervised and guarded by a competent and responsible person, who shall keep said fire under control at all times.

4. Variance. Any person wishing to conduct open burning of materials not permitted herein may make application for a variance to the City Council.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law and upon installation of the appropriate signs notifying the public of said limits. Section 40.03(2) NOISE

Make loud, unusual or raucous noise in the vicinity of any residence or public building which causes unreasonable distress to the occupants thereof.

SECTION 2. Section 40.03(2) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fontanelle, Iowa, 2002 is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

Section 40.03 (3) ABUSIVE, INDECENT, OBSCENE OR PROFANE LANGUAGE.

Disturb the public by the use of indecent, obscene or profane language or direct abusive epithets or make any threatening gesture which the person knows or reasonably should know is likely to provoke a violent reaction by another.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this

ordinance are hereby repealed.
