## City of Fontanelle June 12, 2006

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Glassell, Sickles, Reed, Newton, and Warrior.

Absent: none.

Motion by Reed to approve the agenda with the addition of donation of woodcarving. 2nd by

Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Nodaway Valley Market manager, Tab Rasmussen was present to discuss possibility of scheduling events in the city park with a beer garden, grilled brats and hamburgers, and music on Saturday evenings, modeled after the Clive at Five events. The Fontanelle Bar and Grill would be in charge of the beer garden and Tab would handle the food. They would like to try one and see how it goes. Discussed police presence, hours, and insurance coverage. Susan will check with insurance company and a decision will be made at the next council meeting.

Pat Westphal, 21<sup>st</sup> Century Coop manager, was present requesting assistance with their water bill. Someone had turned on a valve and 221,000 gallons of water was lost before it was noticed. Pat requested some of the water be forgiven or charged at cost due to the Coop providing water previously to the citizens of Fontanelle. No water leaks have been forgiven since the city has been purchasing water from Greenfield. Motion by Glassell to charge the Coop for the water at the city's cost due to their providing water in the past. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Reed. Voting Aye: Glassell, Reed. Voting Nay: Newton, Warrior

and Sickles. Motion failed.

Motion by Newton to renew the cigarette permits for the Nodaway Valley Market, Fontanelle

Bar & Grill and Casey's. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Sickles to adopt a resolution proposing to lease space on the water tower for a telecommunication facility and setting a public hearing date for June 26, 2006. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Glassell. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Reed, Glassell, Warrior, Sickles, and Newton. Voting Nay: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared the resolution duly adopted as:

## A RESOLUTION PROPOSING TO LEASE SPACE ON THE WATER TOWER FOR A TELECOMMUNICATION FACILITY.

Discussed a resolution proposing to purchase land. No action taken.

Motion by Glassell to approve an amendment to the employee handbook changing the insurance cap to \$550.00 per month as previously approved. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Voting Aye: Reed, Glassell, Warrior and Sickles. Voting Nay: none. Abstaining due to conflict of interest: Newton. Motion carried.

Mildred Goetz has donated \$200.00 to the city as a memorial for her husband Herbert. It was decided to use the money to replace the lights in the bandstand. Susan will send a thank you note to Mildred to notify her of the council's decision.

Discussed the Goofy statue Art and Joy Green have donated to the city. The base is finished and the statue will be taken to city hall until it can be installed in the park.

Reviewed compliance with nuisance letters. Fifteen have complied, and several others have made a start. Susan is to send another letter to the non-compliant citizens. Anyone not complying after that will have Affidavits filed with the court system. Susan is to send thank you letters to the ones who complied with the letters.

Discussed problems with the copy machine, which is at least 12 years old. Susan presented quotes for a replacement machine from Office Machines and M & M Sales. Office Machines had offered to bring a machine for Susan to try. She was directed to see if she liked it and a decision will be made at

the next council meeting.

Reviewed report provided by Nathan Byerly. Nathan reported that alcohol compliance checks were performed in the city and all merchants passed. Nathan has been searching for a used patrol car to replace the current vehicle. It is difficult to find a vehicle and then wait until the next council meeting to make a decision. It was decided if a possible vehicle was located, the Mayor and the Safety Committee could make the decision.

Motion by Glassell to approve the clerk's report, list of bills, and minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Carried unanimously.
