


Departmental Reports

March 12, 2007

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Pro-Tem Glassell calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Glassell, Newton, Sickles, and Reed. Absent: Homan, Warrior. All motions are carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Motion by Newton to approve the agenda as presented with the addition of notification of grant funding request results by Jeremy Rounds. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved.

At 7 p.m. a public hearing was held to hear comments concerning the proposed ordinance amendment concerning pit bull dogs and vicious dogs. Peggy Goetz and Sharon Blanchard were present to comment on this amendment on behalf of Clint Goetz. They feel it is too restrictive. Problems with dogs running loose and being tied up so can reach neighbor's property were discussed. It was decided to table the ordinance amendment until April's meeting to see if the problems with the dog can be solved. The public hearing was closed.

Al and Cindy Baldogo have discussed turning part of their property into a city dog pound. They are currently working with the DNR to rehabilitate injured wild animals. Motion by Reed to approve the Baldogo's animal shelter as soon as a license is obtained. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved.

Motion by Sickles to approve the Nodaway Valley Market's license renewal. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Newton. Approved.

Reviewed a proposal to switch the employee's health insurance from Midlands Choice to Blue Access. This would result in a savings for both employees and the City. Motion by Newton to switch effective April 1<sup>st</sup>. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved.

Reviewed request for funding to purchase anti-viral medicine for city employees. Four doses have been purchased as authorized by Homan.

Officer Byerly presented Police Department report. He has been having problems with the new camera system working with the old radio. The repair people feel the best solution would be to return the

current camera system and switch to a different system. This would result in no additional monies being spent, but would entail a budget amendment. Approval was given.

Motion by Newton to approve the list of bills, minutes, and clerk's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Reed.

Now that the snow has melted some the curbs in town have deteriorated this winter and are in very poor condition. Craig will check on replacement methods of asphalt versus concrete. Craig will be purchasing a 15 KVA transformer soon. The Council complimented the Craig, Shawn, and Jerry on the great job they did during the recent blizzard. Susan reported that the public hearing for Eric Ehrenfried's request for annexation will be held in April. She did not receive the paperwork from the city attorney in time to do it this month. She will also have budget amendment figures for April's meeting.

Jeremy Rounds from SICOG sent an email notifying the city that our grant fund request for the water line to the nursing home has been denied. Susan and Craig will proceed with searching for an engineering firm to proceed with plans.

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Glassell, Newton, Sickles, Warrior, and Reed. Absent: none. All motions are carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Motion by Glassell to approve the agenda as presented with the addition of a complaint regarding in home tanning beds that aren't paying commercial electric rates, and a request for tree removal in the city's parking. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved.

At 7 p.m. a public hearing was opened to consider Eric Ehrenfried's application to be voluntarily annexed into the city. No one was present to comment on this. Public hearing was closed.

**Resolution 2007.4: Voluntary Annexation of the Eric Ehrenfried Property.** Newton moved and Glassell seconded to adopt Resolution 2007.4. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Newton, Sickles, Warrior, Glassell and Reed. Approved

**Resolution No. 2007.3: Authorizing the City Clerk to Certify Unpaid Water, Sewer, and Landfill Fees to the County Treasurer for Collection.** Reed moved and Sickles seconded to adopt Resolution 2007.3. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Newton, Sickles, Warrior, Glassell, and Reed. Approved.

Reviewed engineering qualifications submitted by five firms: Kirkham Michael, Nilles Associates, Howard R. Green Company, Snyder and Associates, and JEO Consulting Group. JEO Consulting Group and Kirkham Michael had quoted using an hourly rate for on site observation during construction, but had not quoted the amount of the hourly rate. Motion by Reed to schedule a special council meeting on Wednesday, April 11, 2007 to allow time for Susan to contact these firms and obtain a firm hourly rate. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Glassell. Voting Aye: Sickles, Warrior, Glassell, and Reed. Voting Nay: Newton. Approved.

Motion by Glassell to approve building permits submitted by Christina Bruns for a deck, and Michael Welsch for a pole barn. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Reed. Approved.

Motion by Reed to approve burning variances for Gary Queck and Teresa Scheel. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved.

Discussed Pit Bull Dog/Vicious Dog Ordinance. No action was taken.

Approved proposed budget amendment which will be held in May. If the insurance bill arrives in time, it will be added to the amendment.

Motion by Glassell to schedule Clean Up Day for June 2<sup>nd</sup> with a rain date of June 9. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Sickles. Approved. Susan will notify Doug Hughes, Landfill Director, of the dates.

Motion by Newton to award 1/2 of the CIPCO Economic Development funds to the Summerset Enterprise Club for the grocery store, and 1/2 to the Fontanelle Lion's Club. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Approved.

Discussed vandalism problems that have been occurring in the park restrooms. Craig was instructed to obtain a camera to deter the vandals. If this does not solve the problem, the restrooms will be locked. Police Department report was reviewed.

Motion by Reed, seconded by Glassell to approve the list of bills, minutes, and clerk's report. Approved.
