The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Shafer, Warrior, Sickles, and Glassell. Absent: Reed. All motions are carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Motion by Glassell to approve the agenda as presented. 2nd by Sickles. Approved.

Boring bids for a 2 year contract for 2009/2010 and 2010/2011 were opened. Underground Specialty, LLC was the only bidder with a bid of \$7.50/foot for a 2" pipe bore, \$8.00/foot for a 4" pipe bore, and \$25.00/foot for a 8" pipe bore. Prices include digging cable into boxes, help pulling cable, use of reel trailer, and use of Vac-Tron machine for removal of earth from holes. Motion by Sickles to accept the bid from Underground Specialty. 2nd by Warrior. Approved.

Craig and Audra Ford submitted a building permit for a machine shed, and Brad and Kaye Bax submitted a building permit for an addition to Fontanelle Drug. Motion by Glassell to approve both permits. 2nd by Shafer. Approved.

Resolution No. 2009.11: A Resolution Setting Goals and Establishing Programs for Energy Efficiency. Motion by Glassell to adopt Resolution No. 2009.11. 2nd by Sickles. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Glassell, Warrior, Sickles, and Shafer. Approved.

Resolution No. 2009.12: A Resolution Authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to Execute the Agreement for the Provision of Hazardous Materials Response Services between the City of Fontanelle and Adair County under Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa. Motion by Glassell to adopt Resolution 2009.12. 2nd by Warrior. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Shafer, Sickles, Warrior, and Glassell. Approved.

Discussed donation for Adair County Sheriff's Reserves for helping direct traffic for the parade. In 2007, \$300 was donated, but there were quite a few more officers helping. This year we only had 4 officers present for a shorter period of time. Motion by Sickles to donate \$120.00 per Nathan's recommendation. 2nd by Shafer. Approved.

Discussed ongoing plans for RAGBRAI. Craig was directed to close streets early rather than running out of time later on. Craig will use snow fence in the major intersections to prevent people from driving through the ropes. Reviewed electrical resources in the park. There are 5 vendors who will be in the park area.

Susan received a complaint regarding the can container in the Lutheran Church Parking Lot. Chad Rasmussen would like to clean up the container which is damaged, and the debris surrounding it. The container belongs to the Enterprise Club. Scott will notify the club president of the complaint.

Craig and Susan discussed a roof leak in the community center. The ceiling tiles in the women's and the men's restrooms have water stains. Discussed using local option sales tax monies to repair the roof and make improvements to the building, such as replacing the furnace and air conditioner and doing some weatherization projects.

Nathan Byerly presented his report for the month. He reported he is still looking for one more officer to work RAGBRAI. Two of the nuisance abatements have not complied. Nathan was directed to take the next step of filing charges. The rear axle of the patrol car has been repaired.



Discussed RAGBRAI committee plans to donate landscaping around the welcome to Fontanelle signs on the east and west sides of the city. The committee would like to use the small profits from RAGBRAI to help improve the appearance of Fontanelle. The committee is looking for someone to build a brick enclosure with some low maintenance plantings. They would have to obtain permission from 21st Century Coop for the west side of the city. The east sign is on city property. There is a possibility there may be enough funds to replace the Welcome to Fontanelle signs also. In this case, council approval would be sought beforehand. Permission to landscape was given. Joy Green has a replacement Goofy statue she wants to donate to the city park. The committee is looking into donating paint for the statue.
