



August 10, 2009

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Homan calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Shafer, Warrior, Reed, and Glassell. Absent: Sickles. All motions are carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Motion by Reed to approve the agenda as presented with the addition of library meeting for grant application in Des Moines on Wednesday. 2nd by Glassell. Approved.

There were no building permits to approve.

Motion by Glassell to approve Casey's General Store's beer license. 2nd by Warrior. Approved. Motion by Glassell to approve the Fontanelle Bar & Grill's liquor license pending proof of dram shop insurance. 2nd by Shafer. Approved.

Resolution No. 2009.13: A Resolution Approving Financial Report for the Municipal Street and Parking for the City of Fontanelle for the year 2008/2009. Motion by Glassell to adopt Resolution No. 2009.13. 2nd by Reed. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Reed, Glassell, Warrior, and Shafer. Approved.

Discussed RAGBRAI committee plans to donate landscaping around the welcome to Fontanelle signs on the east and west sides of the city. The committee would like to use the small profits from RAGBRAI to help improve the appearance of Fontanelle. The committee is looking for someone to build a brick enclosure with some low maintenance plantings. They would have to obtain permission from 21st Century Coop for the west side of the city. The east sign is on city property. There is a possibility there may be enough funds to replace the Welcome to Fontanelle signs also. In this case, council approval would be sought beforehand. Permission to landscape was given. Joy Green has a replacement Goofy statue she wants to donate to the city park. The committee is looking into donating paint for the statue.

Motion by Glassell to regretfully accept Nathan Byerly's resignation as part-time police chief for the City of Fontanelle. 2nd by Reed. Approved. Discussed plans to advertise for a replacement. Nathan's report was also reviewed.

Discussed insurance coverage for the water plant; replacement coverage versus cash value. Council preferred cash value insurance in the case of the water plant. Motion by Warrior to accept the clerk's report, list of bills and minutes. 2nd by Shafer. Approved.


Departmental Reports

Craig reported on the fire hydrant which broke during flushing. This caused the entire city to be without water one afternoon while repairs were made. Craig asked permission for Tyson to attend an Underground Electric Workshop in Ankeny at IAMU. Permission given. Susan reminded the council she would be gone on vacation from Monday, August 17th through Friday, August 21st. She will only be working 1/2 day on Friday, August 14th. During her absence, Craig will be in the office every weekday from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. She has placed an ad in the Fontanelle Observer regarding this and the answering machine will be on.

Homan discussed a library meeting he will be attending on Wednesday in Des Moines representing Fontanelle. Discussed possibility of city donating to the building fund if enough money was raised to proceed. Donation of \$3,000.00 from the LOST fund was discussed.

There was no public input.

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. with Mayor Pro Tem Glassell calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Shafer, Warrior, Sickles, and Glassell. Absent: Reed, and Homan. All motions are carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

Motion by Shafer to approve the agenda as presented. 2nd by Sickles. Approved.

Building permits were submitted by Jeff Tuttle for an addition to his house and to finish a garage, and Leo and Rosie Armstrong for a wheelchair ramp for their beauty shop. Motion by Sickles to approve both permits pending Craig's approval. 2nd by Warrior. Approved.

Carol Barrett had submitted a burning variance for the council's approval. Carol is seeking permission to burn small lumbar scraps and weeds. Motion by Glassell to approve the burning variance for small lumber waste only, no drywall or plastics. The weeds can be taken to the city's burn pile. 2nd by Shafer. Approved.

Lillian Nichols, library board president, was present to provide a fundraising update to the council. 75% of the funds needed for the addition are raised, they have \$85,000 remaining. They have a goal of \$25,000 in local funds to be raised. The city has committed \$1,000 previously and they are asking for a larger commitment. Jeremy Rounds from SICOG has provided a resolution to use next month for the council to vote on.

The Iowa Dept. of Transportation has provided a detour agreement to allow them to use 1st Street south of Hwy 92 as a detour next year when they will be replacing 2 bridges east of here. They will document the condition of the road and it will be returned to that condition or damages paid. Motion by Glassell to authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement. 2nd by Sickles. Approved.

The council reviewed the bid submitted by Chad Rasmussen for landscaping around the city welcome signs and also reviewed bid from Piper Graphics for new welcome signs. All supplies will be purchased locally if possible. The work will be paid for by the RAGBRAI committee. The council indicated that if the funds raised from the RAGBRAI visit were insufficient, they would help with the cost. Motion by Glassell to allow the committee to proceed with their plans. 2nd by Sickles. Approved.

Reviewed correspondence requesting volunteers to join a Citizen's Committee to be involved with the process of building a new jail. If anyone is interested, they can contact Susan.

Resolution No. 2009.14: A Resolution Authorizing the Adair County Sanitary Landfill to Issue Revenue Bonds.

Motion by Sickles to adopt Resolution No. 2009.14. 2nd by Warrior. Roll was called with the following voting Aye: Shafer, Sickles, Warrior, Glassell. Approved.

Motion by Warrior to authorize signing the agreement for landscaping between Ron Pezzetti and the Iowa Dept. of Transportation. 2nd by Glassell. Approved.

Discussed request from Albert Ehrenfried for a tube to be placed along the south side of the Eric Ehrenfried property, which Albert mows. Craig will discuss with Eric or Trish Ehrenfried.

Joy Green has a new Goofy statue she wants to donate to replace the broken statue currently in the park. Cindy Baldogo has volunteered to paint it if the city provides the paint. Craig will try to get it picked up and transported to Cindy's so she can work on it over the winter. He will not have time to put the new statue up this fall even if it is painted in time.

Discussed different methods of insurance coverage for the water plant. Decision was made to keep the coverage the same.

Susan requested permission to attend a Banyon Data Systems user group meeting in Des Moines next month. Motion by Sickles to approve this. 2nd by Warrior. Approved.

We have received 3 applications for the part-time police officer position. Interviews are scheduled for next week.

Departmental Reports

Craig reported he looked at the basket truck for sale in Missouri and didn't like the looks of it. We might have to consider spending more money for the better truck. He also reported on the electric line bores they have been doing in the city. Jerry Zimmerline will be off work for 10 weeks for therapy. He will be evaluated again after that. Tyson has been doing a great job with the extra work. Tyson will be gone from Wednesday through Friday for underground school.

Motion to approve the list of bills, clerk's report, and minutes from last month's meeting by Sickles. 2nd by Warrior.
