Mayor Miller declared the public hearing for the City 17/18 Budget, Electric Rate Change, and the Nuisance Abatement closed at 8:08pm.

Police Department report prepared by Pat Henry was reviewed.

Pat Henry reported he should know if he will get the grant for the solar speeding signs. Pat would like to move on with the abatement process on the nuisance on 1<sup>st</sup> street. He would like to first pull off the skirting and see if the trailer home can be pulled out, then next step if it could not be pulled out, is to find a crew to tear it down and remove the trailer home.

Motion by Davis to move forward with the abatement, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dukes. Approved

Motion by Baldogo to approve **Resolution 2017.4 the City Budget 17/18**, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Approved Patty Queck asked how the new electric rates and meter charge would be changed. Davis stated that the meter charge will be going to \$11.00 from \$5.25 and this will cover the operating costs, then the power cost adjustment will go way down and stay at a more even rate. Also the electric rate will go from .07 to .093 per kilowatt. Council also stated that most people should see a small decrease in there bill.

Motion by Baldogo to pass **Ordinance No. 2017.1, changing ordinance 111.05 & 111.06 for electric rates**, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Zimmerline. Approved

Motion by Baldogo to pass Resolution 2017.5 changing the Ordinance 111.05 & 111.06, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Approved

Peg Scott would like to have the avoided cost for solar power changed from Avoided Cost to Net Metering to see if the net metering would be more beneficial for them. The Council would like to see that the solar customers wait till they get all there facts before they bring it back to the Council for a vote.

Council discussed the meter wavier form on removing the 2<sup>nd</sup> heat meter. Zimmerline wishes to see something on next month's agenda to talk about livestock in the city for 4-H projects. Baldogo stated she has had many complaints on trees blocking the view of coming traffic at 1<sup>st</sup> and Benton, the Weed Committee will check in to the issue.

The Mayor declared the meeting adjourned at 8:47p.m.
