## City of Fontanelle March 13, 2017

The Fontanelle City Council met in regular session at 7 p.m. at the community center, with Mayor Miller calling the meeting to order. Council members present were: Davis, Baldogo, Zimmerline, Warrior, and Dukes. All motions are carried unanimously, unless otherwise noted. City employees present: David Sickles, Pat Henry, and Amanda Held. Also present: Joel and Laura Fritz, Jerry Davis, Kristen Jensen, Patty Jacobson, Brandon Raasch, Terri Raasch, John Huddleson, Jodie Cummins, Stacie Euken, Michael Pieken, and Dianna Goetz.

Motion by Baldogo to approved the agenda as presented, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Approved.

Mayor Miller declared the public hearing for Ordinance on Flood Plain Management, open at 7:01pm.

Public Input

John Huddleson question the Council if it would be ok to let some 4-H livestock projects on to his property since the property is grandfathered in. Council state that since it is grandfathered in and has not lapsed the 365 days without livestock, he is ok to allow the projects. The Council did remind Mr. Huddleson that there is an ordinance on not allowing barb wire within city limits.

Unfinished Business

Much was discussed on the request from Kristen Jensen's request to put a bee hive on her property. Motion from Baldogo to postpone voting until April to complete more research, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Warrior. Voting Aye: Davis, Zimmerline, Baldogo, and Warrior. Voting Nay: Dukes. Motion carried.

Motion on the floor from Davis on changing the Avoided Cost from a monthly amount to an average amount. Motion died at the table with the lack of a  $2^{nd}$ .

New Business

Fontanelle Enterprise Club expressed their interest in getting a digital sign for the Park to replace the old billboard. They would like to know if the City could run the power to the sign or what kind of arrangement could be made to pay for the power. Enterprise presenters and council stated this would be a great revenue opportunity for the Club to raise money for the 4th of July Fireworks, and to bring all their information and request to April's Council Meeting.

Motion by Baldogo to approve the Burning Variance for Justi Christensen, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dukes. Approved.

Discussion on having 4-H livestock in town was made by the Council and the attending citizens. A motion by Zimmerline to have a Popular Referendum on November's ballet, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Dukes. Approved

Motion by Dukes to split the 2017 Economic Development payment between Midwest Partnership and SICOG, the same as it was last year, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Davis. Approved

Stacie Euken from Midwest Partnership, presented goals of business retention and workforce development plans with local towns and business for 2017.

Police Department report prepared by Pat Henry was reviewed.

Pat Henry reported the nuisance on 1st street should be removed in the next week. Dukes requested that we keep with what is happening with the house that burnt over the weekend; so that it will not become a nuisance as well.

Departmental report prepared by David Sickles was reviewed.

David Sickles answered question on the bids regarding a new work truck and stated he is still getting bids on the truck boxes.
