Carter and the Summerset Citizens would like to either put in a handicap swing for \$1,600.00, or handicap sand digger for \$1,200.00. The Mayor called roll and the following council members voted Aye: Davis, Zimmerline, Baldogo and Warrior. Voting Nay: none. Absent: Dukes. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

Resolution No 2018.7 for Notice of Hearing on Proposed Urban Revitalization Plan, Davis introduced the resolution and moved its adoption, seconded by Warrior. The Mayor called roll and the following council members voted Aye: Davis, Zimmerline, Baldogo and Warrior. Voting Nay: none. Absent: Dukes. Whereupon, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The Council discussed and found nothing to change in Ordinance sections: General Code Provisions, Admin Boards and Commissions, and Police Fire and Emergencies.

Motion by Davis to approve the purchase of a forest green spinner and a 20 foot fall zone around the new spinner and merry-go-round with wood fibers totaling \$6055.22, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Zimmerline. Approved

Mayor Sickles asked the Council to review the  $4^{th}$ ,  $5^{th}$ , and  $6^{th}$  chapters in the ordinance book and bring back any changes they would have to next month's meeting

Mayor Sickles asked if there were any updates on the purchasing of the new park sign. Dianna Goetz said they should know more by the end of this month.

Mayor Sickles asked the Council how they would like him to handle citizens requesting tree work being done in City right of way. The Council would like David Sickles to look at the trees and if it is not something he feels comfortable handling, to bring it to a Council meeting.

Departmental report prepared by David Sickles was reviewed. David shared an estimate from AccuJet to clean, camera, and map the City sewer lines. Council would like little more information and a contract for next month's meeting.

Police Report prepared by Pat Henry was reviewed. Pat stated he would be back on Monday April 16<sup>th</sup>. Pat also shared with the council how Creston is going to handle fireworks this year for them to think about for next month's meeting. Mayor Sickles and the Council, discussed items they would like to see on next month's agenda: Fireworks.
